ERSE to set up Biomethane Working Group and launches questionnaire for interested parties

ERSE - the Energy Services Regulatory Authority - is to set up a working group to analyse the regulatory challenges arising from the biomethane incorporation into the gas sector, as part of the implementation of the Biomethane Action Plan (BAP).

The biomethane incorporation into the National Gas System (SNG) is one of the BAP goals and is recognised by many as a fundamental step towards the gas sector decarbonisation. To this end, it is important to study different logistical and market participation models in order to establish regulatory conditions and rules within ERSE's remit enabling and facilitate the biomethane incorporation into the SNG.

This working group is aligned with the strategy of promoting the renewable origin or low carbon content gases injection into gas networks and coexists and connects with the 'Monitoring and Coordination Group for the Biomethane Action Plan 2024-2040', already set up by government order.

ERSE seek feedback from operators of the National Gas System's infrastructures, the biomethane production projects promoters and all the organisations and agents interested in this issue in order to identify the regulatory barriers and map out the solutions that will make the BAP's recommendations and the goals of national energy policy viable.

ERSE plans to organise a working session at a later date, where it will present a summary of the received responses and mark the Working Group start.
